European Union WEEE Directive 2012/19/EU

The European Union (EU) implemented the Waste of Electronics and Electrical Equipment (WEEE) directive in 2003 and amended in 2012. The directive lays out the extended responsibility of producers who manufacture electrical and electronic equipment. These guidelines are intended to maximize separate collection and ensure correct processing of WEEE.

Most electrical items can be recycled, which saves natural resources, and mitigates environmental impact. Electrical equipment which ends up in a landfill can result in the release of hazardous substances which leach into the soil and water. The resultant contamination can impact local wildlife and human health.

We encourage all users to recycle products at end of life to make a positive difference for our planet.

Disposal instructions for old electrical and electronic equipment:



This symbol means do not dispose of your product with your other household waste. Instead, you should protect human health and the environment by handing over your waste equipment to a designated collection point for the recycling of waste from electrical and electronic equipment.
